

The Correctional Institute Design event challenges competitors to conceptualize and present a modern correctional facility. Participants will showcase their designs through 3D models and tri-fold poster boards, articulating their vision to a panel of judges.

Entry Requirements

- Teams must be composed of a minimum of 1 and a maximum of 2 member(s).
- Chapters can only register 3 teams to compete.

Materials

Competitors are required to bring the following materials/supplies, as they will not be provided by TPSA. No other supplies/materials will be permitted.

- Tri-Fold Poster Board Board must be white and measure 36" x 48"
- 2-Pocket Folder 2-pocket folder with brads containing photographs of the group carrying out each phase of the design process and any additional project materials.
- Physical 3D model Physical 3D model of a cell within the correctional facility (≤ 18"x18")
- Photo Identification Reference the rulebook (https://tpsa.info/rulebook) for details

Procedures and Timeline

- Check In (10 min Time Limit) Competitors must check in to their event at their designated check-in time. Competitors that arrive ten (10) minutes after their designated check-in time will be marked as no-shows and not be allowed to compete out of respect for the time commitment made by our Judges and Volunteers.
- **Pre-Event Briefing (5 min Time Limit)** After check-in, Competitors will be guided to the designated event area. Once there, the Moderator will provide a comprehensive briefing, detailing the event's instructions, rules, and procedures. This briefing ensures that each Competitor is well-informed and prepared for the subsequent stages of the competition.
- Presentation (10 min Time Limit) The competitors will have 10 minutes to explain their tri-fold information and present their model to the judges.
- Judge's Questions (5 min Time Limit) Judges will have 5 minutes to ask clarifying questions about the presentation/model.
- Evaluation and Scoring (5 min Time Limit) After the completion of the event, the Judges will convene to assess each Competitor's performance based on a standardized rubric. This stage is conducted without the presence of the Competitor. Judges will evaluate the criteria outlined in the rubric to ensure a fair and objective scoring process. Once all assessments are finalized, scores will be recorded for each Competitor.

Rules

- **Project Submission** The tri-fold, 2-pocket folder, and model will remain in the judging room until the end of the entire competitive event. The competitors will be notified at the end of the competitive event where and when to collect their items.
- 2-Pocket Folder Criteria Both competitors must be included in all photographs contained in the binder to demonstrate their work on the project.
 The 2-pocket folder must include the following project materials:
 - 1. Title page with: Name of Correctional Facility, name and picture of both team members, and the school name
 - 2. ≥ 2 (4" x 6 ") photographs showing team members throughout Development/Brainstorming/ Researching
 - 3. ≥ 2 (4" x 6") photographs showing team members throughout Blueprint design
 - 4. ≥ 2 (4" x 6") photographs showing team members throughout 3D Model Design
 - 5. ≥ 2 (4" x 6") photographs showing team members throughout Tri-Fold poster design
 - 6. Photographs must be affixed to white card stock paper (no more than 2 photographs per page)
 - 7. Card Stock with photographs placed within clear protective sleeves
 - 8. Each photograph has a description (time, date, location, individuals pictured, details of activity taking place) located underneath the photograph on the page
 - 9. Phases are divided with tabbed divider pages appropriately labeled with Phase name

Design Requirements

- 1. The correctional institution must not violate the United States Constitution.
- 2. Designs and demonstrative items may not have been used in previous competition years.

· Tri-Fold Poster Board Requirements

- 1. White 36" x 48" tri-fold poster board
- 2. Both sides of board may be utilized only if both sides are solid white in color.
- 3. Nothing adhered to the tri-fold may extend more than 1/4 inch from the surface of the board
- 3D Model The model should be a replica of a cell within the correctional facility you designed.
 - 1. The cell may not be larger than 18" x 18"
 - 2. The model may contain electrical components such as lighting or electronically controlled doors, but it is not required, and does not add to or take away from the score
 - 3. Cell dimensions displayed on model
 - 4. Number of inmates per cell displayed on model and represented by number of beds (with bedding) and additional furniture consistent with the facility you designed
 - 5. All items are reasonably scaled to the overall size of cell
- Aerial Blueprints The aerial blueprint(s) is a "bird's eye" view of the inside AND outside of the facility and must include all of the areas listed below and depict items that would be contained within the space:
 - 1. Medical space(s)
 - 2. Hygiene space(s)

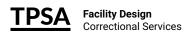
- 3. Chow Hall
- 4. Law Library
- 5. Education area
- 6. Chapel
- 7. Housing areas
- 8. Secured areas/security features (inside)
- 9. Perimeter security
- 10. Outdoor Recreational area.
- *The blueprint(s) may include other areas of a facility not listed above but are not required *The blueprint(s) may include more than one building/section to accommodate all required areas

Professional Dress Guidelines

To secure professionalism points, Competitors should dress in attire that accurately reflects what professionals in the respective public safety careers would wear while performing the tasks associated with the event. Competitors are also expected to consult and follow the Professional Dress Guidelines in the Rulebook to qualify for points. Additionally, participation is contingent upon meeting all prescribed Safety Protocols. The Judge will inspect the Competitors for safety control prior to the start of the event.

Judge Qualifications

· At least one of the judges must have some knowledge of the correctional system and elements contained within the rubric.
